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


CECAP and Community Wide Zero Waste Plan

- CECAP (Board Policy): 90% Diversion by 2040
- Current Waste Diversion Rate: 43.9% (DEQ)
- What does this mean?
 - Total Recycled: 406,000 Tons
 - Total Municipal Solid Waste: 630,000 Tons
- 83% of current Municipal Solid Waste must be diverted to reach 90%
- 83% is the projected amount of total divertible material in the waste stream



Waste Stream and Projections

- Current and Projected Waste
 - Total Waste in 2023 = 1,176,000 Tons
 - Total Waste by 2030 = 1,269,000 Tons
 - Total Waste by 2040 = 1,342,000 Tons
 - Total Waste by 2050 = 1,408,000 Tons
- Average Waste Generated per Person
 - Total Waste per Day: 5.0 lbs
 - Total Waste per Year: 1,800 lbs
- CECAP: 90% by 2040
 - 0.5 lbs per person per day

- Mandatory Recycling and Composting
- Pay As You Throw
- Comprehensive Commercial and Multifamily Programs

- Materials Recovery Facilities
 - Municipal Solid Waste
 - Construction & Demolition Debris
 - Single Stream
- Community Zero Waste Centers
- Decentralized Food Waste Processing
 - Anaerobic Digesters
- Regional Compost Facilities
