PLAINTIFF'S MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION TO USE PRIOR **DEPOSITIONS**

ARGUMENT

1. The Testimony of the Police Officers Bears Directly on the Core Dispute in this Case.

Defendant Amber Laura Heard ("Ms. Heard") claims that Plaintiff John C. Depp, II ("Mr. Depp") physically abused her on May 21, 2016 allegedly leaving marks and swelling on her face under her eye; Mr. Depp denies that. This is the central issue in this case as it was in their divorce action, where the parties took the depositions of the first set of police officers who arrived at the scene that night to respond to a report of an argument between husband and wife. Officer Melissa Saenz and Officer Tyler Hadden both physically examined Ms. Heard's face that night and found no sign whatsoever of any injury to Ms. Heard's face. They also made a protective sweep of the two penthouses at issue: PH-3, where Mr. Depp and Ms. Heard lived; and PH-5, which Ms. Heard used as a storage area for her large wardrobe of clothing and shoes, and did not find any signs of the vandalism Ms. Heard later claimed to have occurred before their arrival. The testimony of the two disinterested, well-trained police officers, taken on July 18, 2016, less than two months after the incident at issue, while their memories were fresh, could not be more relevant, credible, and important for the jury to hear. Though citing no basis, Ms. Heard objects to the use of these transcripts at trial, requiring Mr. Depp to file his motion.

Officer Melissa Saenz

As of May 21, 2016, Officer Saenz served as a training officer at Central Division, with seven years under her belt. *See* Exhibit A at 9. Trained in the investigation and detection of suspected domestic violence, Officer Saenz had answered more than 100 such calls before arriving at the East Columbia penthouses owned by Mr. Depp that evening.

Officer Saenz testified that she interviewed Ms. Heard and closely examined her face and found no marks, swelling, or injury to her face. *Id.* at 20, 22. Nor did Officer Saenz find any

indication of vandalism or property damage despite searching both penthouses. *Id.* at 24-29. Finally, Officer Saenz testified that Ms. Heard told her that she was not hurt (*id.* at 26), nor was Ms. Heard making a complaint against Mr. Depp. *Id.* at 31-33. Officer Saenz testified that had she seen physical injuries to Ms. Heard she would have proceeded with a further investigation even in the absence of cooperation from Ms. Heard. *Id.* at 34. Officer Hadden, a trainee who accompanied Officer Saenz to the penthouses that evening, testified that he and Officer Saenz did not even realize until later the identities (names) of Mr. Depp and Ms. Heard (*see Exhibit B* at 46), which were ascertained by a second set of later arriving officers who relied on the reports made by Officers Saenz and Hadden, so there can be no suggestion that Mr. Depp's celebrity earned him any favorable treatment.

Officer Tyler Hadden

Officer Hadden also testified that he examined Ms. Heard and found no marks, bruising, swelling, or other signs of injury on her face. *See* Exhibit B at 27. Nor did Officer Hadden see any signs of vandalism or property destruction. *Id.* at 34-35. The officer's testimony jibes with that of Isaac Baruch, who lived next door in PH-2, who saw Ms. Heard each of the next several days after the alleged incident (that is, on May 22, 23, and 24), and testified that on each occasion that she had no signs of any injury to her face or any indication that she was wearing make-up to conceal any injuries.

2. Rule 4:7 Allows the Use of These Crucial Prior Depositions.

Interpreting Rule 4:7, the Supreme Court of Virginia has held that in order to admit a deposition from an absent witness in a previous action, three criteria must be met: (1) the deponent must be "more than '100 miles from the place of [trial] or hearing, or [was] out of this Commonwealth"; (2) the deposition must have been "taken in a previous 'action involving the

same subject matter' as the present action"; and (3) the present action must be "between the same parties' as the previous action." *See Burns v. Gagnon*, 283 Va. 657, 680 (2012). Each of these criteria is satisfied here.

First, it is undisputed that Officers Saenz and Hadden both reside in California, well outside this Commonwealth and more than 100 miles from the place of trial.

Second, the depositions from the divorce proceeding involve the "same subject matter" as the present action -- specifically, Ms. Heard's allegations relating to the purported May 21, 2016 incident. See Exhibit C. There is no requirement that the causes of action be identical; rather, there must be a "finding that the party opponent in the prior action had the same interest and motives in examining the deponent that the present opponent has." See Azalea Drive-in Theatre v. Sargoy, No. 73-347-N, 1974 WL 1014, at *1 (E.D. Va. Sept. 16, 1974). Ms. Heard was represented by sophisticated counsel at the depositions in the divorce proceedings, Samantha F. Spector, Esq., and had every incentive and opportunity to cross-examine the deponents regarding the events of May 21, 2016.

Third, the present action is between the exact same parties as the previous action -- Ms. Heard and Mr. Depp. Both Mr. Depp and Ms. Heard were represented by able counsel at the depositions of Officers Saenz and Hadden. Thus, each of the requirements enumerated by the Virginia Supreme Court are satisfied in this case.¹

¹ Mr. Depp also notes two additional requirements that appear in Rule 4:7 which were not addressed by the Virginia Supreme Court in the *Burns* case. Those requirements are (1) that the prior case has been dismissed and (2) that the prior depositions were "lawfully taken and duly filed." See Va. Sup. Ct. R. 4:7(a)(7). The divorce proceeding was settled and dismissed, and the depositions were lawfully taken. See Ex. A and Ex. B. While the depositions were not "duly filed" in the divorce proceeding, that is only because California law *prohibits* the filing of depositions with the court. See Cal. Civ. Proc. Code § 2025.550 ("The certified transcript of a deposition shall not be filed with the court."); see also id. at § 2025.560 ("An audio or video recording of deposition testimony...shall not be filed with the court."). CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Mr. Depp respectfully requests that the Court grant his motion to use the depositions of Officers Saenz and Hadden at trial in the present action.

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found that the "duly filed" requirement is satisfied where the depositions "have been delivered to the attorney taking the deposition or ordering the transcript." See, e.g., In re Paramount Payphones, Inc., 256 B.R. 341, 345-46 (Bankr. M.D. Fla. 2000) (recognizing that in order for a deposition from a prior lawsuit to be admitted, plaintiff had to demonstrate "that the depositions were 'duly filed'" and ultimately holding that the depositions were "duly filed" under the rules "where local rule prohibits the filing of the deposition with the court and where they have been delivered to the attorney taking the deposition or ordering the transcript."). Because of the substantial similarity between Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 32(a)(4) at the time the Paramount Payphones case was decided and the pertinent language of the current Virginia Supreme Court rule (compare Va. Sup. Ct. R. 4:7(a)(7) with Leger v. Texas EMS Corp., 18 F. Supp. 2d 690, 694 (S.D. Tex. 1998) (citing to the pertinent language of FRCP 32(a)(4))), this Court should look to federal case law as persuasive authority, as Virginia courts regularly do. See, e.g., Tabb v. Judd, 2 Va. Cir. 406 (1975) (looking to federal court decisions as persuasive authority in interpreting FRCP 26, which was similar to the Virginia Rule and there were no Supreme Court of Virginia cases on point); Stone v. Clifton Forge Health Care, LLC, 83 Va. Cir. 479 (2011) (holding with respect to FRCP 26 and Va. Sup. Ct. R. 4:1, "In view of the similarity of the two rules, the interpretation of the federal rule provides persuasive authority in interpreting the Virginia rule.").

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



Dear Mr. Bloom:

Please be advised that our firm has filed a Petition for Dissolution of Marriage on behalf of Amber Depp.

As you may be aware, your client and Amber's husband, Johnny Depp, violently attacked and threatened Amber on Saturday night, May 21st, in their penthouse apartment located at 849 S. Broadway.
